HOW TO GET THERE

From Boston Logan Airport

By Taxi: Approx US \$50-\$60 (30-40 minutes).

Rented car: All the major car rental companies have premises onsite at Logan. Parking at the Wylie Center is free.

Directions from Boston's Logan Airport:

When exiting Logan Airport, follow I-93 North.

Turn slightly to the right and follow Rt. 1A North toward Revere for 2.4 miles.

Turn slightly left onto Rt. 60 West. Continue for 1.8 miles.

Enter the roundabout and take the first exit onto Squire Road/60 West. Continue for 0.8 mile.

Enter the next roundabout and take the first exit onto US-1 North. Continue for 7.1 miles.

Merge onto I-95/128 North via the exit on the left, going toward Peabody/Gloucester. Keep left -continue for 1.2 miles,

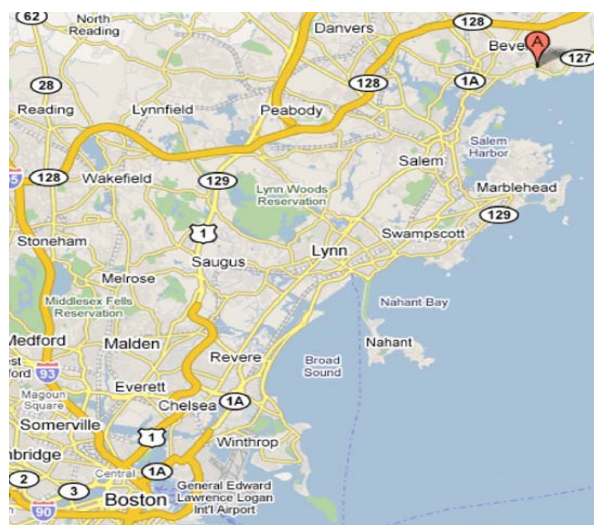
Take Rt. 128 North via Exit 45 toward Gloucester.

On Rt. 128 North, take Exit 17 (Grapevine Road, Beverly Farms). Turn right off the exit ramp and continue to 1.5 miles

Turn right onto Haskell Street (by the cemetery). Proceed to the end

At stop sign, turn right onto Hale Street, Route 127.

Proceed past the Endicott College main entrance on the right; watch for the "Wylie Conference Center" sign on the left
Address is 295 Hale Street. Turn into the driveway.
